# A Fellow's Journey: A Year in the Scottish Highlands

Doctors who embark on their fellowship will feel like they are climbing a daunting mountain on their first day. That was how I felt the day I started my Gastroenterology journey in Hospital Kuala Lumpur in 2019 but a journey of a thousand miles always begins with that first step. Fast forward to the end of 2021, I consider myself extremely lucky to have been given the opportunity to go overseas for an advanced endoscopy fellowship at the Aberdeen Royal Infirmary (ARI), Scotland. I remember clearly the first question I was asked during the interview I had with Dr Perminder Phull, Clinical Lead of Endoscopy of the Department of Digestive Disorders, and Dr Umesh Basavaraju, Consultant Gastroenterologist and Pancreaticobiliary Endoscopist, "Are you sure you are willing to leave sunny and warm Malaysia and come up to cold, cold Aberdeen?"



Though it really was a rather frosty and windy year indeed, it was a decision I definitely do not regret as it gave me an experience of a lifetime with lessons and knowledge I will carry with me for the rest of this never-ending quest in Gastroenterology.

The training provided at ARI was structured. I had four to seven training lists a week for EUS/ERCP, two to three service lists for diagnostic and therapeutic Upper Endoscopy and Colonoscopy (Including Barrett's surveillance, pre and post EMR assessments, dilatations and luminal stentings), weekly MDT meetings, and ran my own pancreaticobiliary clinic and general gastroenterology clinic. I also joined the specialized Inflammatory Bowel Disease clinics on occasions and helped out the Registrars with GI on call at times as well.

Dr Basavaraju and Dr Sandeep Siddhi, my main trainers, were amazing teachers and were patient and dedicated to impart their skills and knowledge to me. I was fortunate enough to not only hone my skills in diagnostic EUS and FNBs, but to also perform Cyst Drainage with LAMS and Celiac Plexus blocks. My ERCP lists were done with Dr Basavaraju, Dr Siddhi, Dr Malcolm Smith and Dr Ashis Mukhapadiya. On top of doing the usual stone clearance and stenting for benign and malignant diseases, I managed to learn spy cholangioscopy and do a number of pancreatic ductal interventions as well.

We organized a few live teachings and courses and the highlight for me was doing solo live demonstrations of hilar stenting and spy cholangioscopy into the pancreatic duct for a pancreatic duct stricture and stone under the watchful eyes of a senior consultant endoscopist from Glasgow.

The NHS was also supportive of training and learning opportunities and I attended and presented a paper during the British Society of Gastroenterology Live 2022 in Birmingham. I was also sent for a number of hands-on training courses for EUS and ERCP in the Kings College in London and Freeman Hospital in Newcastle. Designated time was also allotted to do studies and I managed to complete a few in the year.

Of course, there was plenty to see in the beautiful Scottish Highlands and Europe too. Many a weekend was spent walking along castle ruins, stunning cliffs and shores, dolphins and seals spotting; and for an antiquarian books and fountain pen lover like me, England was a paradise of collectibles. Quite a dent was made in my pockets acquiring new stuff!

Though a year felt too short for me to fulfil all I wanted to gain from there, I am very grateful for the opportunity. The main persons from Malaysia who were extremely supportive of this entire journey were my consultants from Hospital Kuala Lumpur and Dato' Dr Muhammad Radzi Abu Hassan, without whom this fellowship would not have been possible.

I can only hope that everything I have learnt can now be put to use and I will be able to continue learning with time and further experience. It will also be useful to bring in the changes seen overseas and apply them here to improve where we can and grow together as a fraternity. For junior fellows who are interested in going down a similar route, it is important to start preparation early and scout for good fellowship positions. Hopefully with the help of fellows sharing their experiences and pointers, the MSGH and the entirety of our fraternity will be able to help more trainees expand their horizons to build a better collective service in the country for the future.

## MSGH 29<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting by Dr Sattian Kollanthavelu

The 29th Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the Malaysian Society of Gastroenterology & Hepatology was successfully conducted on 20th August 2022 during the Annual GUT Conference at the Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre. This AGM was significant as this was the first physical meeting since the COVID-19 pandemic outbreak in 2020. Major amendments to the Society's constitution were tabled, debated and approved by more than two-third majority of the members present. These amendments marked a step forward to make the MSGH an inclusive and professional society that benefits all members. Full details of amendments will be made available in the AGM minutes. Important changes to be highlighted includes the re-definition of membership categories and new requirement for election of office bearers.

Previously, ordinary membership was open to any registered medical practitioners with postgraduate qualification who has shown interest or engaged in the practice of Gastroenterology & Hepatology and subscribed to the objective of the Society. With the amendment, Ordinary Membership is available only to those with subspecialty gualification and training in discipline related to the practice of Gastroenterology & Hepatology. Life Membership is open to members with at least two years of Ordinary Membership. Also previously, life membership was open to all ordinary members immediately upon joining the Society. Post amendment, non-Gastroenterology & Hepatology related medical practitioners with interest in the field are eligible to apply for Associate Membership whereas previously they were admitted as Ordinary Members. The new Affiliate Membership is open to scientists and allied health professionals who are interested to join

MSGH. It important to emphasize that for trainees to enjoy the travel grants and other benefits accorded presently, they need to be at least Associate Members. The proposed amendments were submitted to Registrar of Societies and have been approved on 8<sup>th</sup> November 2022.

The new changes for election of office bearers require nomination for the position of President Elect, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer to be made in writing by either ordinary members or life members at least two weeks before the AGM. Nomination and voting of the remaining five committee members will be carried out at the AGM. Only life members and ordinary members are eligible to vote.

The statement of accounts presented showed a surplus RM952,696.09 and this increase was due to the excess generated by APDW 2021. The Society is in a very strong financial position at RM6,579,803.22 and most of the money were put into fixed deposits. The Society would continue to support the trainee members by providing event sponsorship and grants on a yearly basis for those who need funding for research. The prize monies for best presentations for both GUT and Endoscopy Workshop have been increased to encourage more submissions and participation.

2022 is coming to an end and 2023 presents a new horizon and challenges post pandemic. It is also the year of election of office bearers for the term 2023-2025. Hopefully, the incoming Executive Committee will be able to carry out all the development from previous years. Thank you.

### **GUT 2022**

This year's Annual Scientific Meeting of the Malaysian Society of Gastroenterology and Hepatology (MSGH) better known as 'GUT' was held at the Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre on 19<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> August 2022. As the beginning of 'post-pandemic' era, it was held fully physical to enable interaction and bonding of fellowship and camaraderie which would not have been possible with a virtual event. The theme this year's meet was 'New Beginning, New Science'. GUT 2022 managed to attract more than 500 local delegates. Twenty-eight biomedical companies also supported in making the event a huge success.

Throughout the three-day event, three special/named lectures, seven symposium sessions and five satellite lunch/tea symposia ware held to cater for an array of topics related to gastroenterology and hepatology. The faculty consisted of 24 international distinguished speakers and 10 local speakers who delivered excellent lectures. One of the highlights was a joint WGO-MSGH Symposium which was held virtually with Professor Dr Geoffrey Metz from Australia, Professor Dr Andrew Veitch from the United Kingdom, Professor Dr Desmond Leddin from Canada and Professor Dr Bishr Omary from the United States discussing on how the global gastroenterology community could meet the challenge of Climate Change. The 22<sup>nd</sup> MSGH Oration lecture was delivered by Professor Govind K Makharia from India who expounded on Coeliac Disease - Its Opportunities and Challenges. The 19th Panir Chelvam Memorial Lecture was given by Professor Dr Justin Wu from Hong Kong on Functional GI Disorders in Asia. There were also sessions on awarding young investigators who presented the best oral and poster presentations. All in all, it was a fruitful meeting and certainly benefited all who attended.

## **Lifetime Achievement Award**

The Executive Committee of the Malaysian Society of Gastroenterology & Hepatology extends its heartiest congratulations to Professor Emeritus Dato' Dr Goh Khean Lee for being conferred the Lifetime Achievement Award of the College of Physicains Malaysia on 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2022.

## LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD Professor Emeritus Dato' Dr Khean-Lee Goh by Professor Dr Lee Yeong Yeh



What is lifetime achievement? For many of us who have known Professor Emeritus Dato' Dr Goh Khean Lee (fondly known as 'KL'), it is easy to understand the meaning and significance of lifetime achievement. Scholarship. Contributions. Leadership. Principles. Mentoring. These are just few key words. Many have greatly benefitted from his mentoring, his constant support, and his endless energy, including myself. My most sincere thanks and utmost congratulations to KL for the award.

Born 15<sup>th</sup> July 1956 in Penang, he came from a typical middle-class family. Being extremely bright, KL was admitted into the medical school of University of Malaya in 1975. Four years after graduation, he joined the Faculty of Medicine, University of Malaya as lecturer, and quickly rose in ranks, becoming the Professor of Medicine in 1998. He went on to develop a world-class gastrointestinal endoscopy unit at University Malaya Medical Centre (UMMC). His expertise is widely recognised and is globally known. He has organised numerous top-class meetings, including the highly successful Asia Pacific Digestive Week (APDW) at Kuala Lumpur in 2010, where he served as President.

Professor Emeritus Dato' Dr Goh Khean Lee has a stellar scientific contribution and a vast research experience. He has published widely and consistently, listed in the recent Stanford top 2% world expert in the field, and earned him the prestigious Merdeka Award in 2011. For his many societal contributions, MSGH had awarded him the lifetime achievement award in 2016. He has retired from service since 2016 and later conferred the Professor Emeritus by University of Malaya. Family is his greatest source of strength; his supportive spouse and closest friend, Su Lin, a consultant ophthalmologist, two daughters Li Yen and Li Syuen and son, Li Han.

Let us celebrate together his outstanding academic achievement, exemplary leadership and continuous pursuit of excellence.
